<b>“IN THE BOOK” OR TEXT-DEPENDENT QUESTIONS</b>	<b>“IN MY HEAD” OR INFERENTIAL QUESTIONS</b>
<p>“Right There” questions: The answers can be found in the text by scanning or rereading.</p> <p>“Think and Search” questions: The answers can be found in the text but require higher-order thinking like comparing and contrasting; drawing inferences; or describing the mood, setting or symbolism.</p>	<p>“Author and Me” questions: The answers are not in the text. These questions require that you think about what you learned from the text and what you know to generate the answer. This invites predictions or text-to-text connections.</p> <p>“On My Own” questions: The answers are not in the text. You must rely only on your own interpretation and experience in order to answer the questions.</p>
